

I write on behalf of Mr. Louis Goldberg. I met Lou when I moved to New Haven in July, 1987, as the rabbi of Young Israel of New Haven. Lou was an active lay leader in our congregation and we worked closely on every aspect of synagogue and Jewish life during the fourteen years we lived in New Haven. We were also neighbors, living just a short distance from each other. We and our families became close personal friends. In the years since we left New Haven and moved to Montreal (in 2001), our personal friendship has remained, notwithstanding the geographical distance between us. I feel I know Lou as well as anyone outside his immediate family.

Lou is highly respected in our community for being a do-er. Without making a show or asking for attention or reward, he just does what is right: giving generously of his time for Jewish and civic organizations and causes, advocating for Jewish education and strengthening Jewish life, and always looking to strengthen the wider New Haven community.

I had many occasions to work together with Lou at his business, Goodcopy, while printing various items for my synagogue. I saw how he used his business to support his family, and to mentor young people – giving them a chance with a job, constructive feedback, and a path to advancement. Over the years, Lou, through Goodcopy, employed and trained several ex-offenders and individuals with other disadvantages. These people had several "strikes" against them, and they just needed one last chance. Lou gave those people another shot, and through Lou's training, mentorship and guidance, I understand some of these people have become rehabilitated and upstanding members of the community. Many of the ex-offenders were hired through Goodcopy's participation with Host Associates, a non-profit organization that facilitated the re-entry of former prisoners into society. In addition, I understand Goodcopy participated in a matching program administered by Goodwill, whereby Goodcopy employed individuals with down syndrome to handle various projects.

While negotiating contracts on behalf of Goodcopy, one theme became clear - Lou is as straight as they come. Therefore, it is no surprise that people trust Lou - he is honest and transparent with his customers, vendors and employees. As a result, Lou's reputation in the New Haven business community is stellar.

Lou has been involved in the leadership of his synagogue, the New Haven Jewish Home for the Aged and other non-profit organizations. Over the years, Lou has become the "go to" person for a wide variety of community projects in New Haven. People knew that Lou would "get it done" - no matter the size or associated prestige--whether it was a building renovation or cleaning refuse from the premises of a community area.

We have been blessed to spend our days together in Goodcopy Printing. I have had many roles over the years and as our family has grown, I reduced the time I devoted to the business. Over the last few years, my focus has been volunteering in Jewish Woman's Renaissance Project to educate woman and their families in Jewish values and a spiritual life in Monsey, New York. People are always amazed that we could work together cooperatively for so long. It worked well because my husband was patient, gave me the opportunity to develop my own skills and interests and because we shared the passion to make a difference in our own lives and in the lives of others less fortunate in our New Haven community and our own Goodcopy family. Balancing our home and work time was challenging, but we were each willing to be flexible and never say I won't do that because it is a woman or a man's job.

Under my husband, Lou Goldberg's, stewardship, Goodcopy has been a corporate contributor not just financially but on a one-on-one basis in hiring, retaining, and supporting our staff. I am proud of his character, his values, his achievements, and his concern for all the Goodcopy staff and his family who are dependent on him.

1. Goodcopy hired ex-offenders through Host Associates, an organization that helps those who have paid their debt to society reenter it. One of our memorable successes was a man released from jail after serving nine years on a murder offense. He maintained that he did not commit the murder, but was in the wrong place at the wrong time. We believed in him and hired him for deliveries. He was a very loyal employee and a goodwill ambassador for Goodcopy. He was always cheerful, and our customers adored him. When Lou gave him a bonus, he cried and hugged him.
2. We hired and trained a recovering alcoholic living in a shelter whom we found by working with a city agency. He was direct with us and said he had to leave work to go to AA meetings. He worked for Goodcopy for over a year until he found a better opportunity working in a large fulfillment center. Two years ago he stopped in to thank us for believing in him and giving him his first chance. Now he is married, has a child, and works as a personal trainer in a high-end luxury spa.
3. We contracted with Goodwill and hired their Down Syndrome clients to handle special repetitive projects. Their clients were gratified and grateful to be employed, and they were a morale booster for our staff.
4. We do our best to treat our staff with respect and consideration and our staff remains with us. Our longest standing employee, another recovering alcoholic and days away from being homeless when we hired him, has been with us for 26 years. Other employers would envy our retention rate.
5. Just as we have had our financial ups and downs, our employees have as well. We have loaned employees interest-free funds to help with down payments on a home or diminishing credit card debt.
6. A small shop is a lot like a family: When one staff member was devastated by illness and could no longer work, we could not abandon her. Goodcopy paid her health insurance until social security disability insurance began.
